I just looked at the forecast for Easter, and it calls for rain. While I prefer 65° and sunny, and the rain may cause a little havoc with an Easter Egg hunt or two, and maybe wilt or muddy an Easter bonnet and/or dress (do people still wear these?), it will not ruin the day.

For Christ has risen! He has risen indeed! Alleluia!

I once heard a speaker on a totally unrelated topic state emphatically, "You gotta' keep the main thing, the main thing." For Christians, Jesus' resurrection from the dead is the "main thing."

Faith is not about laundry lists of rules and regulations. They can be helpful, of course, but they are not the main thing. Sermon series, church buildings, programming, and youth groups are all blessings, but they are not the main thing in and of themselves. All we are and all we do is about life as lived in the hope and promise of Jesus' resurrection.

No matter where you are this Easter: maybe you feel like the weather outside, grey and blustery, the resurrection offers you new hope and the warmth of relationship as Jesus will continue to stay with you as you await your own resurrection of the spirit; maybe you are on top of the world and a beam of sunshine as your family is with you and the ham dinner to follow worship is all ready to go, Jesus is there in your joy and wholeness; maybe you are like most of us, somewhere in between, here the risen Jesus meets all of us as he shows up in our lives building relationships, encouraging growth, and fostering forgiveness. All of this and so much more are only possible because of the resurrection.




