I've always been partial to the history book of the New Testament, the book of Acts. This week, we look again at the stories of the early church and how our stories echo theirs as we live in the hope of resurrection.

One way we tell the resurrection story is to join together to do things we can not do as individuals or even individual congregations, no matter their size. Of course, there is the



ELCA, our national church body, but then there are smaller regional organizations that we call synods; here at St. John's, we are a part of the Central/Southern Illinois Synod of the ELCA.

To best help and enable sharing the Good News of God in Jesus Christ, the Synod recently kicked off a listening and visioning process across the Synod. I am asking you to participate in this process by completing a survey.

Why should you take the time to do this? Well, I have a bunch of reasons:

- 1. You'll likely learn things about yourself and the broader church. You may not know how to answer all the questions, but in so doing, we will know where education and communication may need to be improved.
- 2. Your voice and opinions are essential. No two members of the body of Christ are identical, but we are all called to mission in Jesus's name.
- 3. Finally, if we get over 500 completed surveys, the synod staff of Bishop Greg Busboom, Pastor Amy Ziettlow, and Deacon Jason Fisher will get "pied" in the face.
- 4. And maybe the best reason of all: a challenge gift of \$2,000 will be made to the ELCA. As I write, we are about 180 short of our goal. You, the people of St. John's, can make this happen! I also invite you to become involved by attending an in-person listening event. The synod asks that you register for these in advance, and you can do so on the synod website.

Please take advantage of this opportunity to share parts of your story as we live into the big story of life in Jesus Christ together.
