confrontation: a situation in which people, groups, etc., fight, oppose, or challenge each other in an angry way

In today's scripture lesson from Acts, we hear about confrontation between two groups of people. The first group of people were the Sadducees. The second



group of people were the Apostles of Jesus. New ideas were being expressed that threatened the traditional ideas. Those in power were being challenged to look at a new belief system. And anger resulted.

Confrontation is inevitable as ideas, systems, institutions and even our own hearts begin to change. Is there anyone who enjoys confrontation? Did Jesus ever confront others? Yes... when those in power prevented people without power to live in love, with respect and wholeness.

As Christians, sometimes we are called to speak up, or confront others in Christ's name, with the boldness of the Holy Spirit as our guide. It takes much prayer, listening, reflecting on God's word and being a part of a community to truly speak out in Jesus' name. On behalf of whom do we need to confront power? We also realize that we may be the ones in power!! And how does this fit with our mission to give, grow, worship and love? Complicated questions...

As we seek to welcome them—may we accept new ideas, new ways of expression that keep us all asking questions, listening, and obeying Jesus as we love our neighbors. May we be open to what gifts and energies they bring to us.


